## **PREFACE**

The Center for People Empowerment in Governance (CenPEG) is a young organization founded only in 2004, and it is indeed proud to have initiated a project of such magnitude as the monitoring of the 2010 automated elections in the Philippines. The elections employed a technology that was not only intended to facilitate a quick count of the voting results but more importantly to prevent the usual efforts by unscrupulous individuals and institutions to manipulate the outcome of Philippine elections. For this reason, hopes for the success of the Philippine experiment were high not only within the country but even within the region.
